

PATHWAY TO INDONESIAN MAJOR

Complete 16 units comprising:

0 to 4 units from Indonesian Level 1 Beginner Courses, and

4 units for all Indonesian Level 2 Compulsory Courses, and

0 to 6 units from Indonesian Level 2 Elective Courses, and

6 units for all Indonesian Level 3 Compulsory Courses, and

0 to 2 units from Indonesian Level 3 Elective Courses

Students beginning Indonesian should start with Level 1 courses; those who are at intermediate level should start with Level 2 courses. Students should consult https://languages-cultures.uq.edu.au/study/whats-my-language-level to determine their starting point and receive more detailed information about the courses to complete according to their language level.
