

PATHWAY TO KOREAN MAJOR

Complete 16 units comprising:

0 to 4 units from Korean Level 1 Beginner Courses, and

0 to 4 units from Korean Level 2 Beginner Courses, and

0 to 2 units from Korean Level 2 Elective Course, and

4 units for all Korean Level 3 Compulsory Courses, and

2 to 10 units from Korean Level 3 Elective Courses

Students beginning Korean should start with Level 1 courses; those who are at intermediate level should start with Level 3 courses. The Level 2 elective course is open to all students. Students should consult https://languages-cultures.uq.edu.au/study/whats-my-language-level to determine their starting point and receive more detailed information about the courses to complete according to their language level.
