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Entry Requirements

Structure & Dates

To be eligible for entry to the *Graduate Certificate in Indigenous Language Revitalisation*, you will need to identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and have one of the following:

- A bachelor's degree (or equivalent) in any discipline, or
- Completed post-secondary studies* and have two years work experience involving language and cultural revitalisation, or
- Five years of work experience involving language and cultural revitalisation

*Post-secondary studies refer to any degree qualified as an Australian Quality Framework levels 3,4,5 or 6. For example: Certificate III/IV/Diploma/ or Advanced Diploma.

Provide the following documentation:

- Confirmation of Aboriginal (CoA) and/or Torres Strait Islander status with a common seal from an incorporated community organisation. Where exceptional circumstances apply, a statutory declaration accompanied by supporting materials may be considered. Original or certified copies of CoAs and/or supporting documentation must be provided.
- 2. A statement about your Language work to date.
- 3. If you are applying on the basis of your professional and or Community experience, please provide documentation of this work.

You'll take four core courses to complete the Graduate Certificate.

Each course is taught through weekly on-line 1-2 hour seminars and a 1 week intensive on campus. Dates are set for 2024-2025.
